PROVINCIAL CATEGORIZATION PROCESS (MALE)

- Rural AA 1st teams from centers with an enrolment of 121+ players in the male program (Novice Midget) in their association or amalgamation in the current season. This includes female players registered on male rosters.
 Rural A 1st teams from centers with an enrolment of 81 120 players in the male program (Novice Midget) in their association or amalgamation in the current season. This includes female players registered on male rosters.
 Rural B 1st teams from centers with an enrolment of 51 80 players in the male program (Novice Midget) in their association or amalgamation in the current season. This includes female players registered on male rosters.
- Rural C1st teams from centers with an enrolment of **0 50** players in the male program (Novice –Midget) in their association or amalgamation in the current season. This includes female playersregistered on male rosters.
- Rural A1 2nd teams from Rural AA centers in the Male Atom and Pee Wee age categories.

In the Midget division of hockey, teams will be placed in categories at their regional meetings and are subject to review and approval by Minor Council representatives during the conference call team placement meeting on or before December 15. Regions are required to supply their teams' standings within the leagues they participate in. This information, as well as the teams' official rosters are to be provided to the Minor Council representatives prior to conference call.

In the Bantam division of hockey, 2nd tiered teams will compete in one of the Bantam Rural A – C categories as approved by Minor Council. Regions will be eligible to form Rural AA teams to compete in their own regional league. These teams must form from a maximum of 5 associations within the region. Prior to tryouts, the 5 associations must be declared. Amalgamated associations will be considered as one association if in existence for three consecutive years. These teams will be eligible to participate in the Rural AA provincial category.

In the Atom and Pee Wee divisions of hockey, 2^{nd} tiered teams from Rural AA centers will compete in the "Rural A1" provincial championships. 2^{nd} tiered teams from Rural A – C centers will compete in a lower category as approved by Minor Council.

Male teams will continue to be placed in their respective categories as per Hockey Manitoba regulations and will not be permitted to move down a category. Associations may continue to apply to move up and all team placements will be finalized by Minor Council.

PROVINCIAL HOST CATEGORIZATION (MALE)

Due to the fact that the registration numbers in the current season cannot be verified by the October 1st Provincial host application deadline, each Minor Hockey Association will use the previous year's registration numbers to determine the category they will be eligible to host in the current season. The categorization matrix outlining each Association's category for the <u>2016-2017 season</u> is included on the next page.

Please note that we are aware there may be fluctuation in categories for Associations from year to year and this is mainly a <u>guideline</u> for Associations to use when applying to host a Provincial Championship. Regardless of what categorization process is used, there is no 100% accurate method to determine Association categories. Associations that have information indicating significant changes in for the current season can contact the Hockey Manitoba office to discuss a change in their eligible category. **Please note: Associations may apply to host categories higher than their specified category on the next page.**

PROVINCIAL CATEGORIZATION PROCESS (FEMALE)

For the purpose of Hockey Manitoba minor Female provincial play-off competitions, teams will be placed in categories at their regional meetings and are subject to review by the regional council representatives prior to approval by Female Council at the Semi-Annual Meeting. Regions are required to supply their teams' standings within the leagues they participate in. This information, as well as the teams' official rosters are to be provided to the regional council representatives prior to the Semi Annual meeting.
